PET LICENSING

In New Jersey, it's mandatory that dog owners have their pets licensed. A license tag helps police, animal control, and shelters quickly identify your dog or cat and get them back to you safely. Licensing your pet is important to control the spread of Rabies. Licensing ensures when a dog bite occurs and person is bitten, the town can quickly identify and immediately determine whether the animal is up to date on its Rabies vaccine. Fees from pet licensing are distributed to the statewide Animal population control program.



All Dogs/Cats **MUST** be licensed by January 31, 2024. Please scan QR code on the left to access the online application. Please mail application with a copy of updated rabies vaccine & payment. Rabies vaccine **MUST** be valid through the entire licensing period.



All Nail/Hair Salons **MUST** be licensed by January 31, 2024.

Please mail application, fee and licenses for all employees in the shop.



All Daycares **MUST** be licensed by January 31, 2024. Please mail application along with the fee and license for all employees at the daycare.



CHC & SAC immunization program for uninsured children every 2nd & 3rd Tuesday of the month. Contact the Health Dept. if you have any questions regarding any of the programs listed.

What to Do During a Power Outage

Find out how to stay safe after you report a power outage.

Checking the cause of your power outage:

Your power may be out due to a utility issue or because of a problem inside of your home.

To check if the problem is in your home, locate your fuse box or circuit breaker box. If the surrounding area is clear of water, proceed to the box and ensure that none of your circuit breakers have tripped (indicated by the switch being in the OFF position.) Don't forget to check your main breaker switch as well.

Blown fuses may be indicated by broken wires or scorch marks, but not always.

If the problem doesn't appear to originate in your home, check to see if your neighbors have power. If not, report the outage immediately.



If you have a fire hydrant on or near your property, please clean and keep this area free from snow.




JANUARY WE WILL BE PICKING UP CHRISTMAS TREES, THEY ARE TO BE PUT ON THE CURB ON RECYCLING DAYS. THEY ARE ALSO INDICATED ON THE CALENDAR WITH A TREE.

Bulk pickup is for residential purposes ONLY

- The DPW does NOT pick up contractor debris, concrete, bricks, asphalt, rocks, mortar, stone, cultured stone or any stone-like materials, wet paint, chemicals, tires, fluorescent lightbulbs, vehicle batteries, rechargeable batteries, propane/fuel tanks, fire extinguishers, TV's, computer monitors, computer towers/computer CPU's, laptops, tablets, printers or fax machines.
- The limit per bulk day is 4 pieces of household furniture, 2 household appliances (ex. air conditioning (AC) unit), oven, washer, dryer, refrigerator (DOOR MUST BE OFF), and 1 carpet or rug that does not exceed 12 feet in length and/or 1 foot in diameter (including the pad) or a mixture of fragments from carpet or rug of said size. The DPW will not collect carpet removed professionally.
- Water heaters must have borough-issued inspection stickers on them, or they will not be picked up. Please call the Building Department to schedule an inspection, 201-387-4055, option 4.
- Bulk may not be placed at the curb any earlier than 6:00pm the night before scheduled bulk pick-up days. Bulk must be ready no later than 6:00am on the scheduled day of the bulk pick-up.
- There is a bulk pick-up on scheduled bulk pick-up days only. There are no special pick-ups.

The Building Department

With the cold weather coming, it's important for our residents to be safe and warm in their homes. If your **WATER HEATER, FURNACE OR BOILER** should break down and need to be replaced, please remember that this replacement would be considered **Emergency Work**. The replacement of a water heater, furnace or boiler should be top priority and replaced immediately or ASAP. You have **72 hours to submit a permit application** to the Building Department for Emergency Work. Once the permit is processed and issued, you can then schedule an inspection to close out the permit. Do not be concerned with doing Emergency Work prior to obtaining a permit when dealing with something as vital as heat or hot water in the winter months. If you do find yourself in need of Emergency Work during the winter months, we do ask that you put in a courtesy call to the Building Dept the day of work being performed. **Have a safe and warm winter!**

Social Services

Our guidelines are minimal. We have an intake form to help us identify the applicant's needs. We require proof of residency in Bergenfield and proof of Income for the household. We advocate for families and interact with various county agencies such as Bergen County Board of Social Services, NJ Family Care, WIC, PSEG etc. We also refer our clients to various Food Pantries and Churches within Bergen County. We provide Information to parents for Childcare Resource and Referral Agencies in Bergenfield.



1. Be advised, the first quarter 2024 installment is due February 1st with a grace period date to February 12th. PD5's (Annual Post-Tax Year Annual Statement) Must be mailed out by February 1st and returned by March 1st
2. Qualified veterans, senior citizen, disabled or surviving spouse, Civil union/Domestic Partner of a senior citizen or disabled person qualified for a \$250.00 deduction on their yearly property taxes.
3. Senior freeze property tax reimbursement applications are mailed in the month of February for qualified applicants. These 2023 verification forms are called (PTR-1A and PTR-2A). You may apply by calling 1-800-882-6597 or go to: www.nj.gov/treasury/ptr
4. You may apply for the Affordable New Jersey Communities for Homeowners and Renters (ANCHOR) Program at nj.gov/treasury/taxation/anchor/index.shtml

Code Enforcement

ICE AND SNOW

Homeowners and business owners are reminded that they are responsible for keeping their sidewalks clear of snow and ice. Accumulated snow and ice must be removed within 24 hours. No person, firm or corporation shall cast or throw snow or ice onto a public street or thoroughfare.

PORTABLE BASKETBALL HOOPS

During the winter months, all portable basketball hoops must be removed from the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and curb, or on the street along the curb. Doing so will enable the Borough snow plows to properly clear the streets of snow.


