The Bergenfield Drug and Alcohol Alliance will be donating pizza to the Pizza Positivity program at New Bridge Medical Center. Pizza Positivity is always a huge success! Students write notes of support and inspiration for the people in the recovery center at Bergen New Bridge. The notes are delivered along with pizza for lunch. The pizzas are paid for by the police department or the Alliance. This shows a partnership of support, compassion and understanding with local law enforcement and students.

We will also have a table set up at Family Day that will have some information on alcohol, drugs, vaping, and addiction.



Rent Leveling Board

The Rent Leveling Board promulgates and issues rules and regulations regarding rent control with a maximum yearly increase of 4%.Rent control includes any building or structure with 3 units (non owner occupied) and above fall under rent control. Exempt from this are motels, hotels, and similar type buildings and housing units of two units or less. Housing units that are newly constructed and rented for the first time, are exempt, and the initial rent may be determined by the landlord. Board Members hold hearings and adjudicate applications from landlords and tenants to assist them in the application of the provisions of related Ordinances. They shall hear probable violations and issue findings; are empowered to file complaints and have the authority to order refunds in rent and rebates in the event that they find that a tenant has been overcharged by a landlord.

The Rent Leveling Board meets the first Wednesday of each month and these meetings are open to the public. If you are a tenant or a landlord and have an issue in reference to your rent, you can download and file a form off the Bergenfield Borough website or attend one of our meetings.



Veterans Committee of Bergenfield

Once again, the Mayor and Council call upon all our organizations, large and small, to participate in the Memorial Day Parade to be held on Monday, May 29, 2023, rain or shine. The morning ceremony will be held at 11:30AM in front of the Bergenfield Municipal Building.

All organizations participating in the parade will be assembling at Cooper's Pond at 1:00PM. The parade will start at 1:30PM from Cooper's Pond on West Church Street, the parade will travel to Prospect Ave, and turn left onto Prospect Ave and proceed south on Prospect Ave to New Bridge Road and turn left on New Bridge Road to Veterans Memorial Park.

With military, civic patriotic, fraternal, religious, youth, social, schools, businesses and service organizations in the line of march-interspersed with floats and six to eight marching bands. Our Annual Memorial Day Parade has become one of the best in the county.

General John A. Hogan, Commander-In-Chief of the veteran's group, the Grand Army of the Republic, made a formal proclamation designating May 30, 1868 as a day of remembrance of the nation's war dead. The holiday was originally intended to honor those who died fighting in the Civil War, but unfortunately, that that was not the last conflict that American soldiers lost their lives in after World War I, the holiday's purpose was expanded to include all Americans who died fighting in any war. Memorial Day is a day remembering "those who gave their last full measure of devotion" and to recognize all our veterans who fought globally and "saved the world".

The Health Department

The mission of the Bergenfield Health Department is to protect the health and well-being of the people within our diverse community by promoting and encouraging heal thy behavior and safe practices designed to pr event disease and injury. Our services will be delivered by our highly trained and well-qualified staff, motivated to fulfilling our mission through pro-active, public education, health code enforcement, public health screenings, environmental protection and community involvement.

School-Age Immunization Clinic

The Health Department provides school aged children with vaccines necessary to attend schools in New Jersey. These vaccines include **Tetanus**, **Polio**, **Measles**, **Mumps and Rubella**, **Hepatitis B and Varicella**. Tuberculosis screening is available as required by the NJ Department of Health guidelines.

The Child Health Clinic

Where you can bring your child from ages 2 months to 5 years old to receive healthy child check-ups, childhood immunizations, anemia and lead screenings, and other essential health screenings. Services are provided by the Borough physician and the Public Health Nurses. The CHC is held once a month, by appointment only. There is a \$5.00 fee for each visit. Proof of residency is required.

Adult Health Services Our focus is on preventative health care to include client teaching regarding diseases, and referrals and community services as needed. Periodic adult health screenings include: • Skin Cancer, Vision / Hearing screening. • All Flu shots and adult vaccines are available by appointment only. • All Adult Vaccines cost \$20.00 (administration fee)

Sidewalk Program:



Property owners are responsible for the repair and maintenance of sidewalks. The Borough has contracted Vektor Corporation to fix sidewalks that have been uprooted by Borough Trees. During negotiations the Borough was able to get the contractor to provide a discounted rate for all residents to have their sidewalks fixed at cost to the homeowner (see below for approximate pricing). Please see Borough Ordinance Below Referring to Sidewalks.

- Sidewalks that have a 4' by 4' concrete slab (average sized slab) would be around \$150. •
- Aprons vary in size but an average size apron for one car is 12' by 4' would be around \$648. •

A. The owner or occupant of premises abutting any blue stone or concrete sidewalk shall maintain the flagstone which shall become broken, and shall maintain the flagstones so that the joints thereof are even. The surface of all concrete sidewalks shall be kept roughened, so as not to become smooth and slippery. In case the grade for any sidewalk has been legally established by the Borough, such sidewalks shall be laid and kept at such grade.

B. In case any sidewalk becomes out of repair, the owner or occupant of the lands abutting the sidewalk shall forthwith, upon receipt of written notice from the Council, repair or cause the same to be repaired and made in a good and passable condition, and to conform with the requirements of Subsection A of this section. The Borough may, at its option, upon default in making any of the repairs required by this article, cause the repairs to be performed under the supervision of the Foreman and the cost thereof certified to the Tax Collector and added to the next tax bill.

Twinboro Field Update



The construction is continuing at the 25-acre Twin Boro Field which includes an artificial turf baseball field, an artificial turf soccer field, an artificial turf soccer/football field, sports lighting, field amenities, fencing, and stormwater management improvements. Bergenfield received a \$2.2 million grant towards construction and upgrades from New Jersey's Green Acres program, which helps fund projects that are protecting open spaces, and have provided funding for hundreds of outdoor recreational facilities in communities around the State.





The Building Department



Permit applications and inspections:

A permit application is required for almost all home and business improvements except for interior and exterior painting, residential direct replacements of roofs, most siding projects, direct replacement of flooring and replacement windows and doors of the same size. It is best to call the Building Department at (201) 387-4055 ext. 4 if you have any further questions related to your project and we will assist you. Please call the Building Dept for all necessary inspections during the course of your project. As the homeowner or business owner, it is your responsibility to close out all permits once the project is complete.

What do I need to submit with my permit application?

Completed applications and all supporting documents are required with your construction permit application submission. Depending on the type of work proposed, whether it be building, electrical, plumbing or fire, more information and details may be needed for completed submittals.



You will need the two-page permit application and all necessary Subcodes Technical sections. Please include email address, as correspondence is through email. Drop off completed forms at the building department.

The Building Dept is currently located at the right side of Borough Hall, with the entrance on the outside by the cell tower.

Once the permit is ready to be issued, we will email you with the price and let you know the permit is ready for pick up. Please note: Two (2) sets of constructions plans, and a PDF file are required to be submitted with your application for all construction projects requiring architectural plans.



Code Enforcement



BE PREPARED TO MOW YOUR LAWN

The average date of the first lawn cut is 18th March 2023. Last year, the 20th of March was revealed as the best date to cut garden lawns. This day is officially known as 'First Cut Sunday'.

Remember that by maintaining the lawn of your property, you are contributing to preserve the look and beauty of our town and AVOID being summoned!

(Borough Ordinance 116-1) The owner or tenant of any lands lying within the limits of the Borough shall keep all brush, hedges and other plant life growing within 10 feet of any roadway and within 25 feet of the intersection of two roadways, cut to a height of not more than 2 1/2 feet where it shall be determined necessary and expedient for the preservation of the public safety, within 10 days after notice to cut and remove the same.



DO NOT PARK ON NON - DRIVEWAY AREAS

The CODE ENFORCEMENT Department has been receiving numerous complaints from residents about neighbors leaving vehicles on the grass.

Please be aware that this is prohibited in our town. If you have more cars than you can fit in your driveway, we will gladly review a zoning application to see if is possible to widen the driveway of your property and after the approval, issue you a permit to do so.

(Borough Ordinance 186-49 V): The parking of vehicles on lawns or non-driveway areas is expressly prohibited on residential lots. If a guest needs overnight street parking, resident can call the police desk or go online to request permission to park overnight. Info needed is the vehicle registration, license plate number and the location it's being parked.
