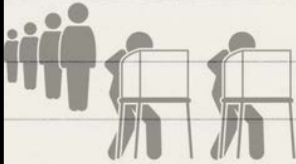

We advocate for families and interact with various county agencies such as Bergen County Board of Social Services, NJ Family Care, WIC, PSEG etc. we also refer our clients to various Food Pantries and Churches within Bergen County. What to Do During a Power Outage

Find out how to stay safe after you report a power outage.

Checking the cause of your power outage:

Your power may be out due to a utility issue or because of a problem inside of your home.

To check if the problem is in your home, locate your fuse box or circuit breaker box. If the surrounding area is clear of water, proceed to the box and ensure that none of your circuit breakers have tripped (indicated by the switch being in the OFF position.) Don't forget to check your main breaker switch as well. Blown fuses may be indicated by broken wires or scorch marks, but not always.

If the problem doesn't appear to originate in your home, check to see if your neighbors have power. If not, report the outage immediately.

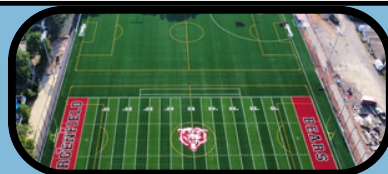

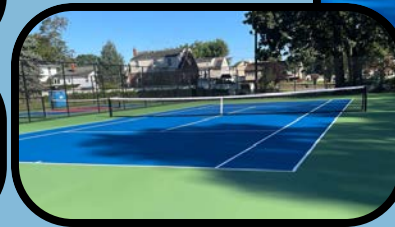
Vivyen Field

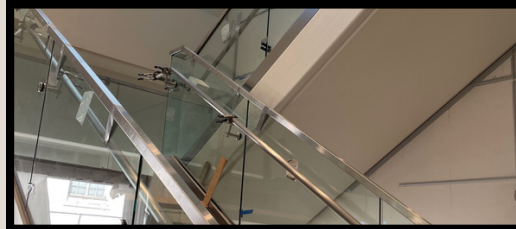
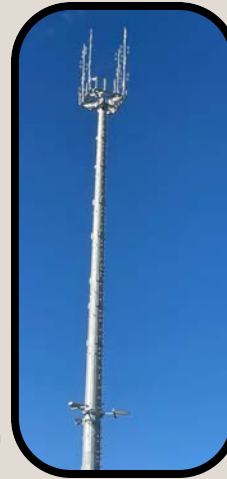
Borough Hall Construction Update

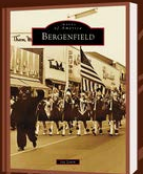

During the colder months it is important to make sure you have newer, working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. The Fire Department sees an increase of carbon monoxide incidents during the holidays due to excessive cooking. It is very important that residents ventilate their residences by opening a window to allow fresh air in. If they do have a detector activate or sound that they are to call 911 and evacuate the residence immediately.

The Bergenfield Volunteer Ambulance Corps, Inc. is the independent not-for-profit emergency ambulance service of Bergenfield, New Jersey. BVAC operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, and answers over 2,300 calls annually. Also, the Ambulance Corps just expanded its fleet to 5 ambulances (previously 4). This allows us to station ambulances in more locations around town so we can respond to emergencies faster. Best of all, BVAC ambulances are funded by donations - not taxes.

Driveways

1. With fall coming it is always a good time to work on repairing your driveway, expand your driveway to add an additional parking space, or just resurface your driveway to cover all the cracks in your asphalt from the sun weathered days of the hot summer sun. If you'd like, you can even upgrade the appearance of your property by using brick pavers with a Belgian Block border.

2. The maximum allowable width of your driveway by Borough Ordinance is 19 Feet wide, with a 20-foot curb cut. Keep in mind you can only cover your property with an impervious surface up to the maximum allowable improved lot coverage of the size of your property.

There are a few things you should know before you move forward with the above-mentioned projects.

A zoning permit and an application for Zoning approval are required by the Borough.

- You must first apply for zoning approval.
- You will need a zoning permit application filled out and signed. You may be required to submit a survey.
- Once your zoning application is approved your permit must be paid, processed, then issued.
- Do not start the work before you have a permit.

FALL/WINTER REQUIREMENTS

- High grass and weeds must be cut and properly disposed.
- Parking of vehicles on the lawn or non-driveway areas is prohibited.
- Unregistered or inoperable vehicles are not permitted to be parked anywhere on your property.
- Trash cans cannot be left out on sidewalks & must be removed as soon as possible after garbage pick-up.
- At no time is construction debris to be placed at the curb.
- Do not park your vehicle on the leaves, as it may cause a fire.
- As of October 9, 2023, leaves and grass clippings must be placed in the appropriate paper bags and placed at the curb on designated pick-up days.
- Branches and twigs must be bundled.
- Make sure storm drains are clear of leaves and other debris.
- Snow must be cleared from sidewalks within 24 hours.
- Icy sidewalks must be immediately addressed.
- Do not plow or shovel snow onto the street.
- Holiday lights must be tested prior to use inside and/or outside the house.
- Portable basketball hoops cannot obstruct the sidewalk or street when not in use or during a snow event. The ordinance will be strictly enforced.
